

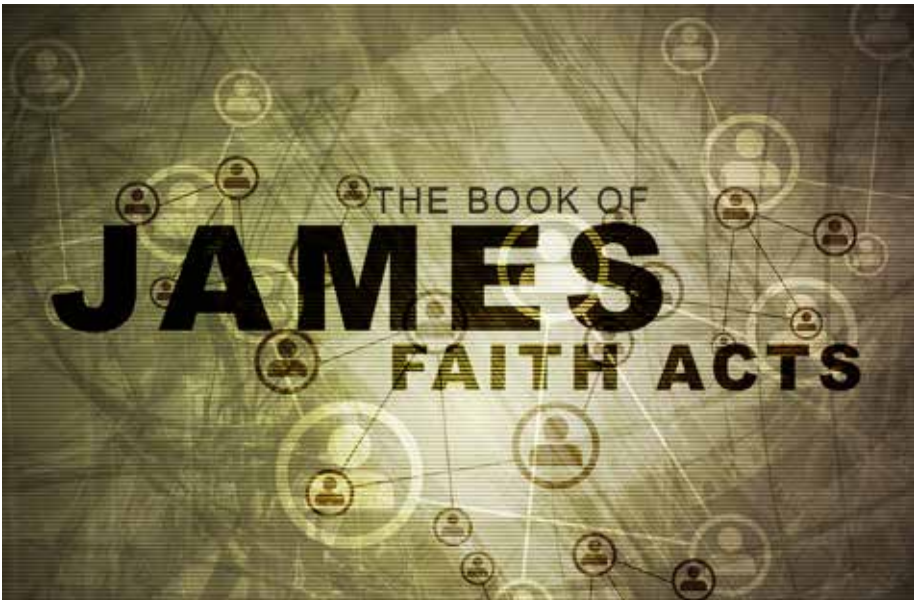

TOGETHER IN SCRIPTURE

John Chapter 17

Context: Setting the Table

In his first twelve chapters, John introduced the witnesses to Jesus and described his public ministry, including his first six signs and the increasing opposition these signs led to. Chapters thirteen through sixteen record Jesus's washing of his disciples' feet, followed by his "farewell discourse," in which he prepared his struggling followers for his soon coming departure. In this seventeenth chapter, Jesus concludes this process of preparation with an audible prayer to his Father.

Content: Hearing the Text

Read John 17 together out loud.

Credo: Believing the Truth

It was time. The betrayer was already on his way. As his last moments with his disciples ticked away, Jesus began to pray to his Father. He prayed for glory, knowing that glory could only come through the agony of the cross. He prayed for the Father to keep his disciples safe in the world that hated them, even as he purposely sent them out into it. He prayed that all his disciples, present and future, would be so shaped by the truth that they would once again demonstrate to the world the loving unity that was lost to humanity at the fall. Best of all, he prayed that all of his disciples might one day come to be with him where he is. As the followers of Jesus today, we live in the confidence that the Father did not, does not, and will not leave these requests unanswered.

Conduct: Reshaping Our Walk

Discuss the meaning of the text and then walk through the following application questions as you discuss the difference this meaning ought to make in our lives today.

We are constantly tempted to either so isolate ourselves from the world that we no longer have any meaningful contact with it, or to so integrate ourselves into it that we become indistinguishable from it. What are some of the ways in which this dynamic shows up in our lives?

What are some ways in which we make the unity of believers a lower priority to us than it is to Jesus?

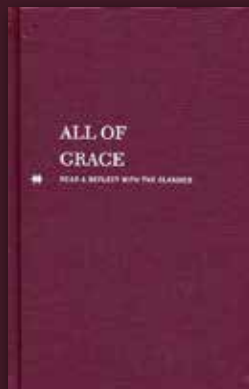
