

TOGETHER IN SCRIPTURE

Genesis 29:31-30:24

Context: Setting the Table

After a creational prologue, Genesis divides into two unequal halves of five sections each. The first half of the book (2:4–11:26) deals with the history of humanity as a whole, from its creation to the birth of Abram. The second half of the book (11:27–50:26) focuses on the story of the patriarchs. In this section of the Jacob story, his four wives give birth to twelve children while struggling with one another.

Content: Hearing the Text

Read Genesis 29:31-30:24 together out loud.

Credo: Believing the Truth

Jacob's family was hopelessly broken. Leah was fertile but hated, desperate for the love of her husband. Rachel was loved but barren, frantic for children and willing to do almost anything to get them. Jacob, drained by his labors for the manipulative Laban, did nothing to resolve the crisis in his family—taking two more wives hardly helped to resolve the conflict between the first two! Yet though the envy and jealousy that characterized Jacob's home bore the destructive fruit that it always does, God continued to work out his plan to redeem the world through the offspring of Abraham—a plan that finds its final fulfillment in the descent of a city on whose gates are written the names of all twelve of Jacob's sons.

Conduct: Reshaping Our Walk

The conflict between Rachel and Leah vividly illustrates the destructive power of envy. In what areas of our life might we be tempted to inflate our sufferings and downplay our blessings? *Examples*: In our families; in our careers; in our finances; in our health, etc.

Despite the desperate brokenness of Jacob's family, it had a permanent place in God's plan to redeem the world through the offspring of Abraham. How might we be tempted to measure God's ability to accomplish his purposes through us by our self-determined "usability" rather than by the power of his grace? Examples: Assuming that God is obligated to use us greatly because of all of the problems that we don't have; Assuming that God is unable to use us at all because of the "baggage" that we carry from our past, etc.
