



TOGETHER IN SCRIPTURE

Genesis 29:1-30

Context: Setting the Table

Following its magnificent introduction, Genesis divides into two unequal halves of five sections each. The first half of the book (2:4–11:26) deals with the history of humanity as a whole, from its creation to the birth of Abram. The second half of the book (11:27–50:26) focuses on the story of the patriarchs. In this section, Jacob arrives at his uncle Laban's home in Haran and marries his cousins Leah and Rachel.

Content: Hearing the Text

Read Genesis 29:1–30 together out loud.

Credo: Believing the Truth

Invigorated by his encounter with God at Beth-el, Jacob arrived in Haran. Providentially meeting his mother's family almost immediately, he was empowered to perform an astonishing feat of strength and soon welcomed into Laban's home. Yet although Laban's manners were as smooth as Jacob's skin, his heart was every bit as devious as Jacob's own. After seven years of labor for Rachel, Jacob was given Leah instead—only for Laban to act as though Jacob was the one in the wrong! Yet even as Jacob began to reap the miserable harvest his misdeeds had planted, the God who had promised to be "with him" continued to be at work both on him and through him.

Conduct: Reshaping Our Walk

Despite Jacob's extensive track record of heel-grabbing trickery, he seems to have been genuinely shocked by Laban's treachery. What are some of the ways in which we are prone to judge other's actions by a different standard than we judge our own? *Examples*: What we are willing to do to others in order to accomplish our goals; Criticizing others for things about which we would ourselves be unwilling to receive criticism, etc.

Leah's marriage to Jacob had a terrible beginning. Yet in God's good grace, it would be through her that the line of Christ would come and it was with her that Jacob would request to be buried at the end of his life (Genesis 49:31). How might we be tempted to believe that our circumstances are so broken that not even God can work them together for good?

Examples: Relationships that appear hopelessly broken; Personal sin that seems to exclude any future usefulness, etc.
