



TOGETHER IN SCRIPTURE

Genesis 33:1-33:20

Context: Setting the Table

Following its magnificent introduction, Genesis divides into two unequal halves of five sections each. The first half of the book (2:4–11:26) deals with the history of humanity as a whole, from its creation to the birth of Abram. The second half of the book (11:27–50:26) focuses on the history of the patriarchs. In this section, Jacob experiences a surprising reconciliation with Esau, the brother whose anger he had dreaded for so long.

Content: Hearing the Text

Read Genesis 33:1-33:20 together out loud.

Credo: Believing the Truth

Jacob's wrestling match with God had left him a changed man. Courage had replaced cowardice, humility had replaced arrogance, and the one who had once stolen blessings now freely gave them away. God, in whose hands are the hearts of all men, protected Jacob by radically changing the heart of Esau toward his brother, resulting in a reconciliation that was as complete as it was unexpected. Just as he had promised all along, God continued to be "with Jacob," and brought him safely back to the land of Canaan he had left so many years before.

Conduct: Reshaping Our Walk

Jacob's continued fear of meeting with Esau, though understandable, turned out to be entirely misplaced. How might the greatness of our fears and the weakness of our faith tempt us to sinfully avoid needed conversations with members of our family and others in our life?

Examples: A refusal to deal honestly with our own or others' struggles with sin because of a fear of the relational consequences; An unwillingness to share the gospel out of a fear of persecution, etc.

Though he continued to have times of struggle and weakness, Jacob's character and conduct were radically altered after he wrestled with God at Peniel. What are some of the ways in which God has changed your character and conduct? In what areas of your life is divine transformation not yet evident?

Examples: Deceit replaced with truthfulness, anger replaced with patience, greed replaced with generosity, etc.


