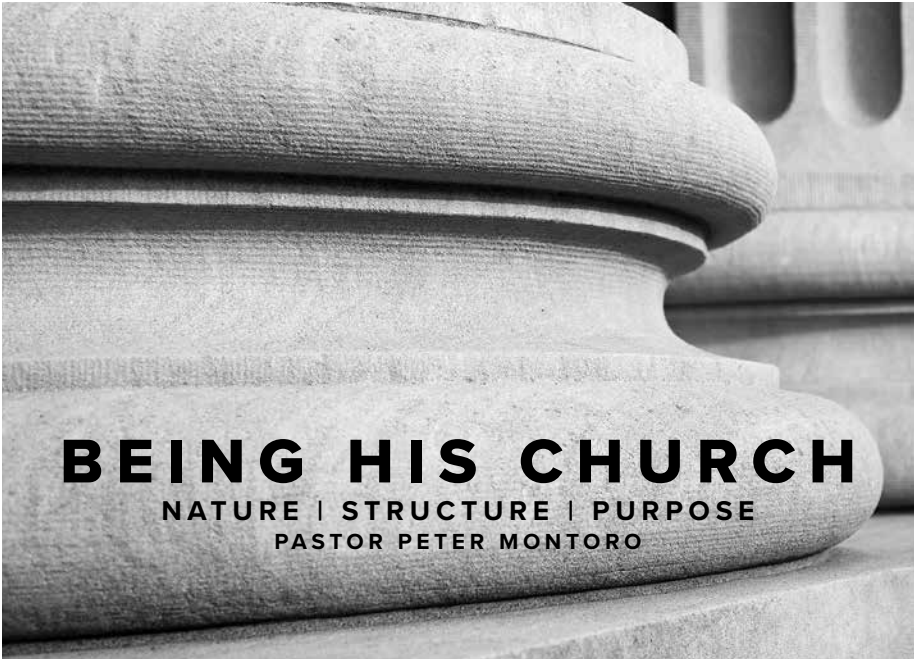

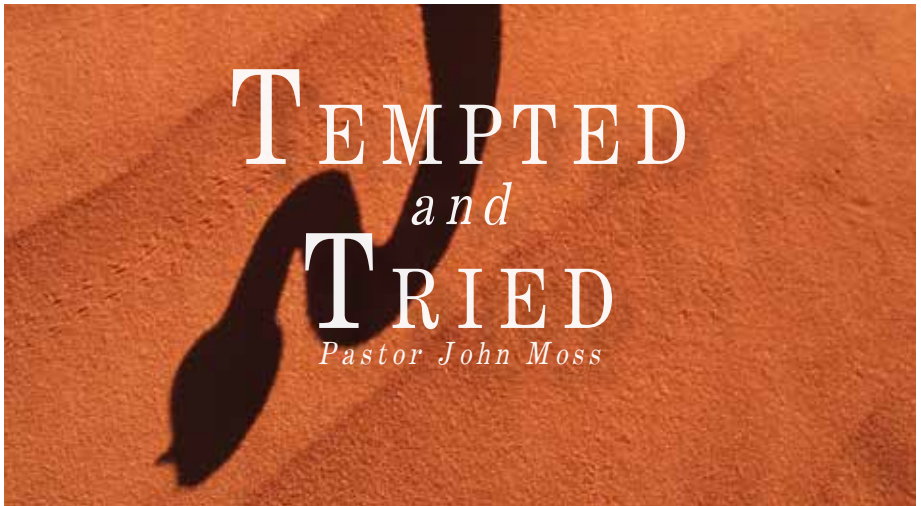

TOGETHER IN SCRIPTURE

Genesis 34:1–34:31

Context: Setting the Table

After a stunning prologue, Genesis divides into two unequal halves of five sections each. The first half of the book (2:4–11:26) deals with the history of humanity as a whole, from its creation to the birth of Abram. The second half of the book (11:27–50:26) focuses on the history of the patriarchs. In this section, God preserves the family of Jacob from intermarriage with the surrounding Canaanites.

Content: Hearing the Text

Read Genesis 34:1–34:31 together out loud.

Credo: Believing the Truth

Every character in this difficult story is profoundly broken and every aspect of it is tragic. Dinah is misguided and foolish. Shechem is abusive and impulsive. Hamor is manipulative and conniving. Jacob is cold and cowardly. Simeon and Levi are deceitful and violent, and the rest of Jacob's sons are little more than scavengers. Yet despite the opposition of his enemies and the utter moral failure of his own people, God continued to fulfill his gracious promises and to accomplish his redemptive purposes.

Conduct: Reshaping Our Walk

While the details of Shechem's crime were particularly outrageous, all of us are tempted to "see" what we want and then proceed to "take" it, regardless of the consequences. What are some of the areas of our own lives in which the desire of our eyes can lead us astray?

Examples: Irresponsible impulse purchases; ethically questionable opportunities for financial advantage; unclean entertainment of all kinds, etc.

Those in positions of authority face a constant temptation to use their position to influence others for their own benefit. How might we, on however small a scale, be tempted to do the same thing?

Examples: Training our children with a view to our present convenience rather than their ultimate character; Using our personality or position to manipulate others to accomplish our goals, etc.

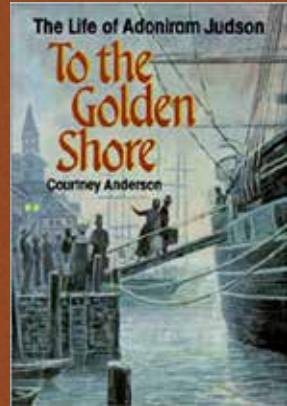
