TOGETHER IN SCRIPTURE

Genesis 39:1–20

Context: Setting the Table

Following a creational introduction, Genesis divides into two unequal halves of five sections each. The first half of the book (2:4–11:26) deals with the history of humanity as a whole, from its creation to the birth of Abram. The second half of the book (11:27–50:26) focuses on the history of the patriarchs. In this section, Joseph faithfully serves his Egyptian master Potiphar while steadfastly resisting the temptations of Potiphar's wife.

Content: Hearing the Text

Read Genesis 39:1–20 together out loud.

Credo: Believing the Truth

Enslaved by his own brothers and purchased by an Egyptian, it must have seemed to Joseph as though the God of his father had abandoned him. Yet he hadn't—far from it. In fact, as he faithfully served a wrongful master, the Lord was "with Joseph," causing him to prosper in the most difficult of circumstances while secretly equipping him for future greatness. In the end, the unjust slavery and evil slander that Joseph endured, devastating as they were at the time, were the very things that God used to accomplish his plan to "save much people alive."

Conduct: Reshaping Our Walk

Despite the loss of his family, his freedom, and his reputation, God was nevertheless very much "with Joseph." What are some of the circumstances in which we might be tempted to assume that God has abandoned us when in fact he has not?

Examples: The loss of a loved one, financial difficulties, serious health challenges, etc.

It was through his management of Potiphar's household that Joseph learned the skills necessary to later rule over Egypt. How might we allow our disappointment or frustration at the difficulties of our present circumstances to cripple our future?

Examples: Justifying laziness because we think our job is a "dead end", focusing on the way others have wronged us in the past instead of what we are called upon to do in the present, etc.

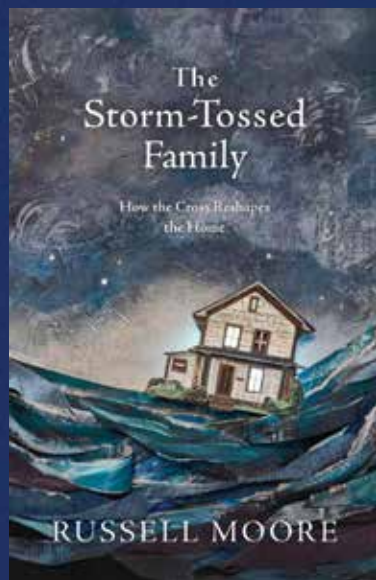
