

TOGETHER IN SCRIPTURE

Genesis 41:1-24

Context: Setting the Table

The second half of Genesis (11:27–50:26) has five sections of alternating length. The first, from 11:27–25:11, provides the "generations of Terah," focusing on the story of Abraham. The brief second section (25:12–18) provides the generations of the passed-over line of Ishmael. The third section (25:19–35:29) provides the "generations of Isaac," focusing on the story of Jacob. The brief fourth section (36:1–37:1) provides the generations of the passed-over line of Esau. The fifth and final section (37:2–50:26) provides the "generations of Jacob," focusing on the stories of Joseph and Judah. In our text this week, God uses the dreams of Pharaoh to deliver Joseph from his unjust imprisonment and exalt him to the position of power and influence he had been preparing for him all along.

Content: Hearing the Text

Read Genesis 41:1-24 together out loud.

Credo: Believing the Truth

At the tender age of seventeen, Joseph's pampered life as the favorite child of his wealthy father was rudely interrupted. Despite his brutal enslavement, God made him to prosper and he guickly rose to become the chief overseer of Potiphar's household. Once again, he was treacherously thrown into a pit from which there seemed no way out. Once more, God made him to prosper in the most unfavorable of circumstances, giving him the opportunity to win favor with the chief butler, an important and influential member of Pharaoh's court—who proceeded to promptly forget Joseph the moment he was no longer needed. Yet at the very point when it must have begun to feel as though God's hand of blessing served only to make Joseph's life worse, God sent Pharaoh a dream that led to Joseph's immediate exaltation to the very place of power and influence he had been preparing him for all along. God's plans are always better than our own—even and especially when he hasn't yet told us how.

Conduct: Reshaping Our Walk

What are some of the situations in which we might be tempted to lose hope when we do not see visible evidence of God's faithfulness to us?

Examples: Long-term illnesses; Broken relationships; Unjust treatment by others, etc.




