TOGETHER IN SCRIPTURE

LEVITICUS 14

Observation (14:57):

The reason why these long and detailed laws about determining the difference between the clean and the unclean were so important is because Israel had been called to be a “holy nation” (Exodus 19:6; 1 Peter 2:9), and only the clean could be set apart as holy.

Application (14:21–22):

Throughout the Old Testament, consistent attention is given to the needs of the poor and vulnerable, even including the distribution of a tri-annual tithe to non-citizen immigrants (this is the meaning of the term “stranger” in the Pentateuch), the fatherless, and the widows (Deuteronomy 14:28). We find this same care exemplified here. While the required offering could be adjusted down to that which even the poorest could afford, even these poorest of the poor still had to bring that offering for themselves. How might we be tempted to buy into the false dichotomies of our culture by either, on the one hand, hard-heartedly ignoring the needs of the poor, or, on the other, degrading their humanity by removing the continued need for personal responsibility on their part?

MARK 4

Application (4:24):

The more heed we pay to what God has already made clear, the more he will make clear to us. How might we be tempted to ignore this most basic of principles in our lives?

Examples: Refusing to take even the most basic steps of every-day obedience until God sends a “sign” that reveals “his perfect will” for our future; Ignoring or even scorning the ordinary human means through which God normally chooses to providentially guide his people.
