Romans 3

Application Question (3:2):

Even though very few of them would have owned their own copies of even a single book of Scripture, it was still an incredible privilege for those under the old covenant to have been entrusted with "the oracles of God." How might we—who can hold the entire canon of Scripture in our hands—be tempted to take this far greater privilege for granted?

Examples: Prioritizing media consumption over scripture reading, cherry-picking what seems "relevant" to us instead of pursuing a deeper knowledge of the whole counsel of God, etc.

Application Question (3:25-26):

The bloody and shameful death of the perfect Son of God on a Roman cross was the only possible way for God to remain just while justifying sinners like you and me—the forgiveness that he freely offers us came at a tremendous cost. What are some of the ways we might be tempted to take this forgiveness lightly?

Examples: Using God's forgiveness as an excuse to indulge in habitual sin, refusing to forgive when forgiveness is costly because we have forgotten the cost that was paid for us, failing to recognize that the forgiveness we expect from others always comes at a cost, etc.







For years, émigrés from the former Soviet bloc have been telling Rod Dreher they see telltale signs of "soft" totalitarianism cropping up in America. Identity politics are beginning to encroach on every aspect of life. Civil liberties are increasingly seen as a threat to "safety." Progressives marginalize conservative, traditional Christians, and other dissenters. Aleksandr Solzhenitsyn famously said that one of the biggest mistakes people make is assuming totalitarianism can't happen in their country. Many American Christians are making that mistake today, sleepwalking through the erosion of our freedoms. Live Not By Lies will wake them and equip them for the long resistance.
