

Romans 8:18-39

Application Question (8:26-27)

Even when we don't know what to pray for, we have the promise that the Spirit of God is making intercession for us according to the will of God. Though our prayers are often weak, we should not be discouraged because we are not the only ones praying. What difference should this precious reality make in our own prayer life?

Examples: It should humble any pride we might be tempted to have in our prayers; It should encourage us to continue praying, even when we can't think of what to say or how to say it, confident that God's gracious care of us is not dependent on our own eloquence or insight.

Application Question (8:35-39)

There is no one, however powerful, and nothing, however dreadful, that can separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord. How should this transform the way we think about the difficulties that we face in this life?

Example: We should remember that the sufferings of this world, though real and great, are not worthy of being compared with the coming glory (v18); Rather than envying those who have chosen earthly prosperity over eternal treasure, we should instead pity them, etc.





For years, émigrés from the former Soviet bloc have been telling Rod Dreher they see telltale signs of "soft" totalitarianism cropping up in America. Identity politics are beginning to encroach on every aspect of life. Civil liberties are increasingly seen as a threat to "safety." Progressives marginalize conservative, traditional Christians, and other dissenters. Aleksandr Solzhenitsyn famously said that one of the biggest mistakes people make is assuming totalitarianism can't happen in their country. Many American Christians are making that mistake today, sleepwalking through the erosion of our freedoms. Live Not By Lies will wake them and equip them for the long resistance.
